

Hunters Ridge Community Association
Hunters Ridge Golf and Country Club
Golf Committee Meeting
Monday February 25, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 3:00pm. A quorum was established. A request to silence cell phones was made.

In attendance:

Chairperson Ron Parmiter, Fred Vosen, Clara Vahldick, Fran Mainella, Norm Petelik, Andy Rogalski, Pat VanNotti, Head Professional Rob Harpster, General Manager Don Huprich and Board Representatives Don Wirsbinski and Lorrie Holly. Betty Vail was unable to attend.

Ron Parmiter opened up the meeting by welcoming new members Fran Mainella, Clara Vahldick, Fred Vosen and Betty Vail. And thanking retiring members Shelly Schilling, Lou Seria and Merle Kratz for their service to the Committee.

Minutes were approved.

1. Golf Reserve – Balance through January is \$570,560 with an additional \$25,000 from the golf assessments.
2. Golf Membership – We currently have 345 golf members. 217 have golf with trackage and 128 without trackage. Members have raised concerns that there may be non members playing on the course. It is important to keep in mind that if there is no trackage on the cart, it does not mean that the player is not a member. Rob Harpster assured the Committee that our private club status has been honored.
3. 2019 Maintenance – In the months of February through July we experience a lack of rain. Don Huprich and Rob Harpster have asked that the 90 degree rule be in effect and ask that everyone ensure that this rule be followed, It was decided that the same summer schedule for maintenance be implemented this year. Therefore 2 weeks in July and August will be used. It was requested that Rob Harpster give advance notification of when maintenance will take place so that members can plan accordingly. The Pro Shop will continue to plan outings during this time and work out a schedule with local clubs.
4. Old Business – There was no old business
5. New Business – We currently have 345 members. If we were to bring our

memberships up to our limit of 425, we would probably have to go to a computer system. The general concensus was that none of our members would agree to a computer system. Therefore a discussion took place on the best number of memberships. If we were to go below our 425, no Board approval would be required. If we opt to increase our limit of 425, Board approval would be required. The Golf Committee will meet with the Finance Committee early next week to discuss this in depth.

6. Ladies combo tees were discussed. Rob Hapster feels that combo tees will not work for the V tee players. The Tee Box Subcommittee established at the last meeting also felt that the combo tees would not work for the V players. Since the survey results were so close (52% in favor, 48% against), the subcommittee recommended an alternative it thought would appeal to everyone. The IV tees would be moved on holes 1,4,13 and 15. A trial of these new locations met with some resistance. The Golf Committee recommended that Pat VanNotti, Clara Vahldick, Fran Mainella and Lorrie Holly meet to arrive at a final solution. The Golf Committee would like the results by the next meeting.
